Founded in 1985, the college sought to democratize access to academic excellence, ensuring that students in historically underserved locales could avail themselves of robust intellectual facilities.

Evolution and Accreditation:

The college’s journey toward formal academic standing began with its initial affiliation with the University of Burdwan on September 20, 1985. While this partnership commenced on a provisional basis, the institution’s rapid development led to its substantive affiliation on August 30, 1988. This milestone solidified its mandate to serve as a beacon of higher learning within the district’s most socio-economically challenged frontiers.

Academic Scope and Achievement:

Originally, the curriculum was designed around a comprehensive suite of nine core disciplines, encompassing:

- Humanities: English, Bengali, Sanskrit, and Philosophy.
- Social Sciences: History, Political Science, and Education.
- Applied Sciences & Wellness: Geography, Physical Education, and Sports.

Beyond mere instruction, the college has garnered distinction for its commitment to holistic excellence. By prioritizing the intellectual empowerment of marginalized communities, it has earned a prestigious reputation for fostering social mobility through rigorous scholarship.

Governance and Institutional Synergy:

The internal architecture of the college—defined by the seamless cooperation between the Teachers’ Council and the Students’ Council—has remained a cornerstone of its stability since its inception. In accordance with the statutes of the University of Burdwan, the institution’s governance evolved from an initial Ad-hoc Governing Body to a formal, Regular Governing Body established on December 15, 1987. Since then, the administration has operated with a progressive ethos, maintaining a harmonious and productive rapport among all stakeholders, thereby contributing meaningfully to the advancement of the broader society.

Originally established under the aegis of the University of Burdwan, the college transitioned its affiliation to Bankura University in 2017. While its journey began modestly within the precincts of Amarkananda Deshbandhu Vidyalaya, the institution migrated to its own dedicated campus in 1987—a serene, verdant expanse that provides an idyllic environment for scholarly pursuit.

The college is formally recognized by the University Grants Commission (UGC) under sections 2(f) and 12(B). Reflecting a trajectory of continuous improvement, the institution secured a 'B+ grade' during its inaugural NAAC accreditation cycle in 2017 and subsequently achieved a distinguished 'B++ grade' in its second cycle in 2025.

Gobinda Prasad Mahavidyalaya: A Brief History

Historical Foundation & Heritage:

Established in 1985, the college is named after the eminent freedom fighter and social reformer Gobinda Prasad Singha. Inspired by the ideals of Sri Ramakrishna and Swami Vivekananda, this region served as a pivotal centre for the nationalist movement. Notably, Mahatma Gandhi inaugurated a temple on these grounds in 1925, and the area was later graced by the presence of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose and Dr. Syama Prasad Mookerjee.

Institutional Evolution & Accreditation:

Affiliation:

Beginning its journey on September 20, 1985, under the University of Burdwan, the college secured substantive status in 1988. Since 2017, it has been affiliated with Bankura University.

Campus:

Originally operating from Amarkanan Deshbandhu Vidyalaya, the institution transitioned to its own serene, verdant campus in 1987.

Recognition:

A UGC-recognized institution, the college earned a B+ grade in its first NAAC cycle (2017) and advanced to a B++ grade in its second cycle in 2025.

Academic Framework & Mission:

The college currently offers Major courses in nine disciplines across Arts and Sciences, complemented by short-term certificate courses focused on skill development. It maintains a strong academic reputation in core subjects such as Bengali, English, History, Political Science, and Geography.

The primary mission of the college remains the empowerment of economically underprivileged students from Amarkanan and its surrounding hinterlands, fostering their growth into enlightened and responsible citizens of modern India.

Location Overview:

Gobinda Prasad Mahavidyalaya is situated in a serene environment, strategically connected via **National Highway 14 (formerly NH 60)**. The institution is easily accessible from the major urban centres of South Bengal:

- **From Bankura Town:** The college is located approximately 23 km north of Bankura district headquarters. Commuters traveling along NH 14 should reach the 'College More' intersection and proceed 450 meters west along the Gangdua Dam Road to reach the campus.
- **From Raniganj Town:** For those traveling from the north, the college is approximately 27 km south of Raniganj via NH 14.
- **From Durgapur Town:** The institution is also well-connected to Durgapur, situated at a distance of roughly 35 km via the standard highway route.

The college's location at Amarkananda offers a perfect blend of rural tranquillity and excellent highway connectivity, making it a convenient destination for students and visitors alike.



The rules/guidelines related to the admission in Under-Graduate programmes for the Academic Year- 2026-27:

1. New Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programme, UGC 2022 (as per NEP 2020) for 4 years undergraduate programme(s) (Hons. /Hons. with Research) for “UG Degree Programmes with Single Major” only as per the curriculum of Bankura University will be considered for the academic session 2026-27.

2. As per New Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programme, UGC 2022 (as per NEP 2020) and as per the curriculum of Bankura University the Undergraduate degree programmes of either 3 or 4-years duration, with multiple entry and exit points and re-entry options, with appropriate certifications following the curriculum such as:

i. a UG certificate after completing 1 year (2 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study, provided that an internship (additional 4 credits) must be completed by the students who will exit the programme after securing appropriate credits. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven (7) years.

ii. a UG diploma after 2 years (4 semesters) of study provided that an internship (additional 4 credits) must be completed by the students who will exit the programme after securing appropriate credits. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven (7) years.

iii. a bachelor's degree after a 3-year (6 semesters) programme of study,

iv. a 4-years bachelor's degree (Honours) after a 4-year (8 semesters) programme of study. If the student completes a rigorous research project/ dissertation in their major area(s) of study in the 4th year of a bachelor's degree then (Honours with Research).

3. Minimum Eligibility for the Undergraduate Programmes:

Entry requirement for 1st year 1st semester is successful completion of 10+2/ Higher Secondary (12th Grade) or equivalent stage of education from any recognized Board/Council/University by Bankura University.

4. Merit & Tie Break Rule:

i. Best five (5) of the H.S. Subjects must be adopted for calculating the total marks and percentage.

ii. In case wherever only Four (4) subject are offered by any recognized Board/Council etc, as the case may be in H.S. or equivalent examination, first Language will be added to prepare the merit list on the basis of best five of H.S. subjects as stated earlier.

i. In case of equal marks in Class XII/10+2 or equivalent level results, total marks/percentage of marks of immediately preceding examination is to be taken into account for ranking and after that the date of birth (in ascending order) where the marks secured by the candidates in Secondary or equivalent level is the same.

5. Reservation of Seats:

Reservation of seats will be made as per norms of the Government of West Bengal.

6. Session Gap:

For admission to the Under Graduate Course (1 year, 1st semester), there should not be a gap of more than 5 years between the year of Higher Secondary/10+2 or equivalent Examination and the year of admission to Under Graduate Programme of study i.e., 2022, 2023, 2024, 2025 and 2026. In respect of calculation of marks, no deduction should be made in case of candidates passing out in previous years.

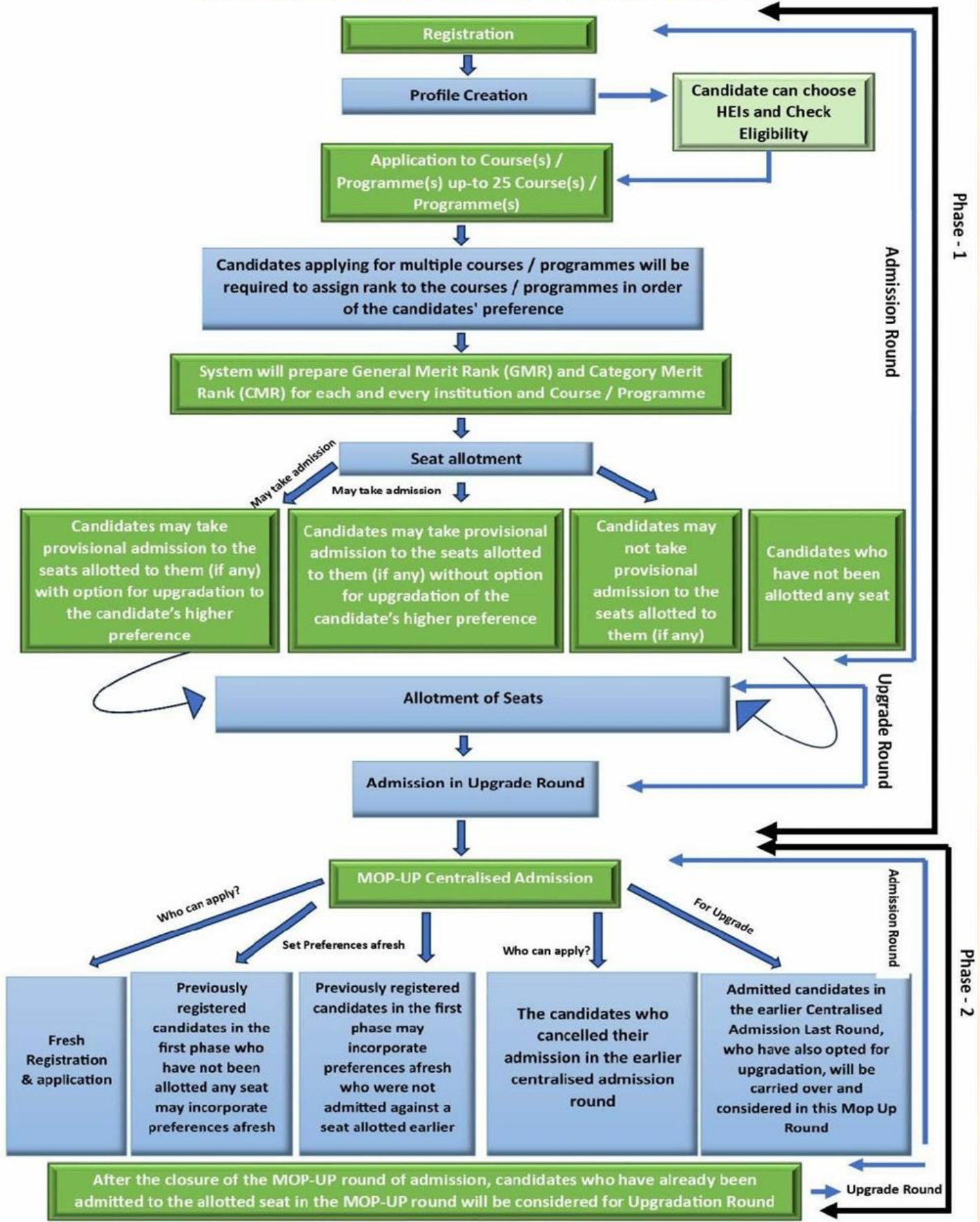

Eligibility for the Under Graduate Programmes:

The eligibility here is maintained for the credit structure for UG Degree Programme with Single Major only (attached herewith).

1st Year

Entry 1: Entry requirement for 1st year 1st semester is successful completion of 10+2/ Higher Secondary (12th Grade) or equivalent stage of education from any recognized Board/Council/University.

Exit 1: Students who opt to exit after completion of the first year and have secured 40 credits will be awarded a UG certificate if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the first year. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

2nd Year

Entry 2: Entry requirement is a UG Certificate obtained after completing the 1st year (Two Semesters) of the UG Programme.

Exit 2: Students who opt to exit after completion of the second year and have secured 82 credits will be awarded the UG Diploma if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the second year. These students are allowed to re-enter within a period of three years and complete the degree programme within the maximum period of seven years.

3rd Year

Entry 3: Entry requirement is a UG Diploma obtained after successful completion of two years (Four semesters) of the UG Programme.

Exit 3: Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme will be awarded UG Degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 124 credits and satisfying the minimum credit requirement as per the credit structure.

4th Year

Entry 4: An individual seeking admission to a Bachelor's degree (Honors/ Honours with Research) in a specified field of learning would normally have completed all requirements of the relevant Three-year Bachelor's Degree.

Students who secure 75% marks and above in the first six semesters and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream in the fourth year. They should do a research project/dissertation under the guidance of a faculty member of the University/College. The research project/dissertation will be in the major discipline.

Exit 4: 4-year UG Degree (Honours): A four-year UG Honours degree in the major discipline will be awarded to those who complete a four-year degree programme with 164 credits and have satisfied the credit requirements as per the credit structure.

4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research): Students who secure 75% marks and above in the first six semesters and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream in the fourth year. They should do a research project/dissertation under the guidance of a faculty member of the University/College. The research project/dissertation will be in the major discipline. The students who secure 164 credits, including 12 credits from a research project/dissertation, are awarded UG Degree (Honours with Research).

N.B.

i. The duration of the UG programme is 4 years or 8 semesters. Students who desire to undergo a 3-year UG Programme will be allowed to exit after completion of the 3rd year. If a student wants to leave after the completion of the first or second year, the student will be given a UG Certificate or UG Diploma, respectively, provided they secure the prescribed number of credits (as per the credit structure).

Students who exit with a UG certificate or UG diploma are permitted to re-enter within three years and complete the degree programme.

ii. Students may be permitted to take a break from the study during the period of study but the total duration for completing the programme shall not exceed 7 years.

Medium of Instruction

Medium of Instruction in the class rooms will be Bengali/English/Sanskrit. Students will have to write their answer in Bengali/English/Sanskrit.

Change of subjects

Change of subject (Minor/Multidisciplinary) may be done as per rule of the Bankura University (NEP- 2020 regulations).

Identity Cards

Identity Cards are issued to all students who should always keep these cards in their possession for their own safety and security.

Library Cards

Library Cards issued to all the students who must use the same for borrowing library books. Library Card for students is compulsory.

Percentage of Attendance

Student reading in degree classes must have 75% percentage of attendance in order to appear at examinations as per the Bankura University guidelines.

Discipline

Students are to attend their classes regularly. Absence from classes or any examination without sufficient reason will be treated as breach of discipline. Negligence in class work, disorderly conduct or misconduct etc. will invite disciplinary measures against the students concerned.

Anti-Ragging Policy of our Institution

According to the UGC Regulations (No: UGC-Rag/C/96/15/SCHE/2009) circulated on April 13.2009) ragging in our Institution is strictly prohibited and totally banned, and anyone found guilty of ragging is liable to be punished in any one or more than one way mentioned below:

- Cancellation of admission
- Suspension from attending classes
- Withholding/Withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits
- Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process
- Withholding results
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
- Rustication from the institution for a period ranging from one to four semesters
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution
- Collective punishment: when the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers.

The Internal Complaints Committee (ICC)

The Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) has been constituted in the college under Section-3 of UGC act-1956 for prevention, prohibition, and redressal of the sexual harassment of women at the workplace. ICC meets on a need basis to address any complaints from students, teaching and nonteaching members and takes necessary

action. The College has a zero-tolerance policy towards any such transgression. The college is committed to providing a safe and conducive work and academic environment to students and its employees and is extremely alert to matters pertaining to any kind of harassment and gender sensitivity.

Women's Cell

The Women's Cell provides an integrated and interdisciplinary approach to understand the social construction of gender that tries to shape the experiences of women and men in the campus of Gobinda Prasad Mahavidyalaya.

Career Guidance and Placement Cell

Training, Placement and Awareness Cell of the College help the students to find jobs in various sectors by organizing programmes in collaboration with professional training institute for the benefit students.

Grievance Redressal Cell

The UGC has regulations and letters regarding anti-ragging for higher educational institutions which have been implemented in the college. The college takes all necessary steps to implement the UGC guidelines regarding anti-ragging such as submission of affidavit by the student and guardian on anti-ragging at the time of admission, installation of CCTV cameras at vital points and a clear mention of anti-ragging warning in the institution's prospectus and information booklets /brochures. The college has both online and offline mechanism for submission of students' grievances. There is an online portal for students' grievances where they can submit their grievance which is then taken up for consideration by the respective committee. Students can also register their grievances offline by submitting written applications stating the nature of their grievance. Appropriate action is then taken against the submitted application.

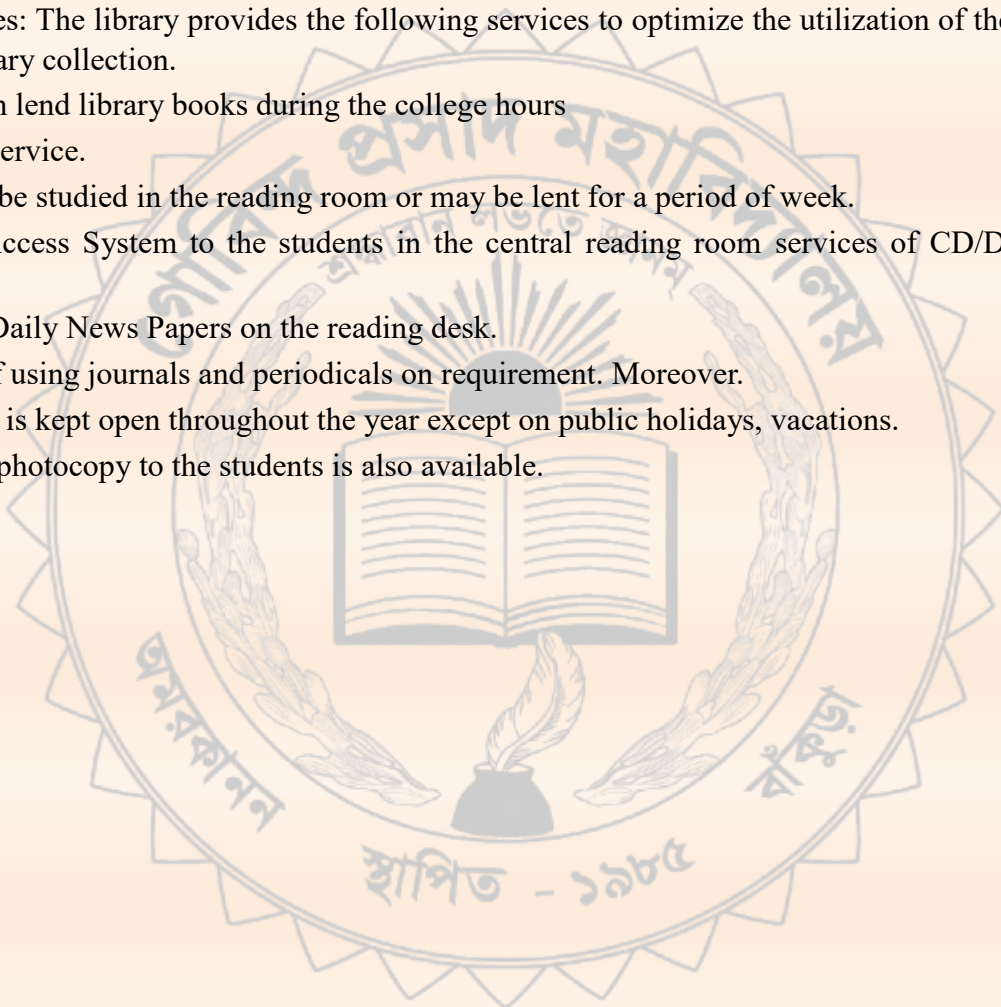
College Library

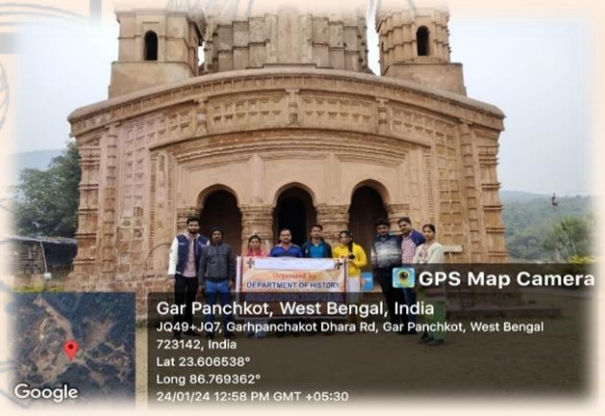
Salient features and facilities
